

Volunteer Opportunities

Along with all the opportunities to clean and fix up the parks listed in our events section, please consider ongoing opportunities you and your active organization may want to take up:



Adopt-A-Park: Volunteers remove trash at least once a month and report safety hazards and concerns to Parks & Recreation. A sign is displayed in the adopted park recognizing the name or group name and the contribution they make to the park.

<u>Adopt-A-Trail</u>: Adopt a segment of trail with the same responsibilities as adopt-a-park -- the program always needs more community involvement!

<u>Clean & Green</u>: Community volunteer groups make a physical improvement to a park under Parks & Recreation leadership. Painting and pruning for trail safety are the two most popular projects.

<u>Foster-a-Flower</u>: Parks and Recreation displays over 1,000 hanging baskets in the Downtown and Spenard business districts each summer. Flower baskets can be fostered for \$75. Foster two baskets for \$150 and we will place a plaque on a light pole recognizing your donation.
