#### **Recent News**

On Saturday, August 23, 2008, the Anchorage Park Foundation and the Parks & Recreation Department celebrated the Grand Opening of the new <u>Cuddy</u> <u>Family Midtown Park</u>.



This summer featured a variety of construction projects in Anchorage parks:

- 7 new natural turf multi-use/soccer fields in Kincaid Park
- 24 of the <u>2006 Challenge Grants</u> will be completed before snowfall
- Work commenced on 9 of the <u>2008 Challenge Grant Projects</u>, including <u>Bear Valley Neighborhood Park</u>, <u>singletrack bike trails</u> in Far North Bicentennial Park and <u>whale bones display</u> at Kincaid Park

This year's **Youth Employment in Parks** (YEP) summer program

doubled in size since last summer. We worked with 50 Anchorage teens on a variety of recreation and parks projects. We plan to continue to expand this program next year!


