

In summer 2011, Carl will visit parks throughout Anchorage to discover the small forms wildlife living amongst us. He will photograph not just the large fauna that we are used to, but the small insects, mammals, amphibians and plants that make up the micro-ecology of our local parks.

Carl will work with **Youth Employment in Parks** Crews to connect Anchorage children to the wildlife in their neighborhood parks. Working as a team, Carl and the YEP crews will track and catch small animals in parks and photograph them while observing their behavior and learning about their role in the food chain.
