Anchorage has 10,946 acres of municipal parkland, 223 parks, and over 250 miles of trails and greenbelts that link neighborhoods with surrounding natural open space and wildlife habitat. hese are considerable assets for the citizens of Anchorage to enjoy and maintain.

## Louie G. Mizelle Park

This neighborhood pocket park falls victim to vandalism and crime. As a small, beautiful green space in the Mountain View neighborhood, creative design that focuses on safety and crime prevention along with community usage will revitalize this park. Redesigning this pocket park will improve visibility and park safety. In 2011, Louie G. Mizelle Park received a D on its Park Report Card. Community members expressed interest in installing picnic tables and benches to improve usage.

In the summer of 2016, the Anchorage Park Foundation and Parks & Recreation Department plan to complete improvements in Louie G. Mizelle Park with the help of community volunteers and the input of a neighborhood park committee. We invite the Alaska State Legislature to join us in investing in the future of Louie G. Mizelle Park and the Mountain View community. The Anchorage Park Foundation will match legislative investment in neighborhood park fix-its with volunteer involvement and generous support from the Rasmuson Foundation's Anchorage Parks Initiative.
