Parks Recreation

Anchorage has 10,946 acres of municipal parkland, 223 parks, and over 250 miles of trails and greenbelts that link neighborhoods with surrounding natural open space and wildlife habitat. These are considerable assets for the citizens of Anchorage to enjoy and maintain.

Parks & Recreation launched the Clean & Green, Safe & Secure Campaign with the Anchorage Park Foundation to upgrade the safety, function, and appearance of Anchorage parks. To get involved, call 343-4587. In 2011, Meadow Street Park received an F on its Report Card. Community members reported concerns about the parking lot filling up with mud because of drainage issues and the water being dirty due to storm water run-off. Overall, the park is not perceived as particularly welcoming or informative. Existing parking areas are unpaved, which creates pot-holes and erosion near Little Campbell Creek. Paving the parking areas, thus eliminating the pot-holes and erosion, will improve both the accessibility of the park and environmental sustainability. Input from the Community Councils and neighbors indicate that this area of town with high density housing currently lacks a neighborhood park play area.

The German immersion school, the Rilke Schule German School of Arts and Sciences, owns the land adjacent to Meadow Street Park. Improvements to this park will provide the opportunity for the school to utilize the park as an outdoor classrom and educational space.

In the summer of 2016, the Anchorage Park Foundation and Park & Recreation Department plan to complete improvements in Meadow Street Park to improve accessibility and neighborhood engagement. We invite the Alaska State Legislature to join us in investing in the future of Meadow Street Park and the Abbott Loop neighborhood. The Anchorage Park Foundation will match legislative investement in neighborhood park fix-its with volunteer involvement and generous support from the Rasmuson Foundation's Anchorage Parks Initiative
