

Interior awards its prestigious Partners in Conservation Award to a handful of projects and programs around the country successfully engaging diverse partners in completing conservation projects to meet the Department's goals and objectives.

The Fish & Wildlife Service nominated the YEP program in recognition of its partnership with FWS in accomplishing conservation projects in Anchorage since 2007. With FWS funding, YEP crews have restored streambanks, built sustainable trails, protected riparian areas and removed invasive weeds.
