Eastchester/Woodside Park

Eastchester (Woodside) has the potential to be a community gathering space for the surrounding neighborhood and church. New picnic tables, trash cans, and a picnic shelter would vastly improve the value of this park to the neighborhood. The tot play equipment (2-5 yrs) is in decent shape, but there is need of a play area for older children such as a basketball court, table tennis table, or climbing feature.

The field and the parking lot of Eastchester (Woodside) Park suffer from problems with standing water. Improvements to the parks drainage would remedy these problems and improve the functionality of the park. There are 7 visible electrical boxes within this section of Eastchester Park. Consolidation of these utilities would drastically improve the visual appeal of this park. Anchorage Park Foundation is working with Eastchester (Woodside) Park's neighbor, Shiloh Baptist Church, as a community partner on this project.

- Need new picnic tables and trash cans
- New picnic shelter
- Improve drainage issues
- Consolidate electrical boxes
- New play area for older children
