Frontierland Park

The playground and safety surfacing of Frontierland Park were installed over 20 years ago. The park was redesigned and rebuilt in 1979. Volunteers from the Lions Club helped with removal of the old play equipment to get ready for the new. In 1981, Municipal Light & Power agreed to underground the power lines so that the whole area was parkland.

This is an important neighborhood playground for the Downtown and South Addition neighborhoods with valuable proximity to the Delaney Park Park Strip. Neighbors have requested installation of a fence around this playground to keep children from wandering into the street. These improvements will vastly enhance the appeal and safety of this park for the neighborhood and larger Anchorage community.

In the summer of 2016, the Anchorage Park Foundation and Parks & Recreation Department plan to complete improvements in Frontierland Park with the help of community volunteers and the input of a neighborhood park committee. We invite the Alaska State Legislature to join us in investing in the future of Frontierland Park and the Downtown community. The Anchorage Park Foundation will match legislative investment in neighborhood park fix-its with volunteer involvement and generous support from the Rasmuson Foundation's Anchorage Parks Initiative
