Springer Park

Neighbors have identified a number of areas in which Springer Park needs improvement. The picnic tables need repainting and the wooden trash can containers are in disrepair. The lines demarcating the basketball court have worn off and the volleyball pits are run down. Graffiti covers the dilapidated play equipment, and the surfacing surrounding the play equipment is in poor condition.

In the summer of 2015, the Anchorage Park Foundation and Parks & Recreation Department plan to complete improvements in Springer Park with the help of community volunteers and the input of a neighborhood park committee. We invite the Alaska State Legislature to join us in investing in the future of Springer Park and the Spenard community. The Anchorage Park Foundation will match legislative investment in neighborhood park fix-its with volunteer involvement and generous support from the Rasmuson Foundation's Anchorage Parks Initiative.



Parks & Recreation

Anchorage has 10,946 acres of municipal parkland, 223 parks, and over 250 miles of trails and greenbelts that link neighborhoods with surrounding natural open space and wildlife habitat. These are considerable assets for the citizens of Anchorage to enjoy and maintain.

Parks & Recreation launched the *Clean & Green, Safe & Secure Campaign* with the Anchorage Park Foundation to upgrade the safety, function, and appearance of Anchorage parks. To get involved, call 343-4587.

Fix-It List Priorities

- Update playground and surfacing
- Replace picnic tables
- Repaint lines and repair cracks on basketball courts
- Add sand to volleyball pits and repair separation material
