6 **Subject:** Bi-annual Anchorage Park Foundation Board Report on Park Investments
7

8 In 2004, community members and leaders from the Municipality of Anchorage worked
9 together to found the Anchorage Park Foundation (APF) to make it possible for
10 individuals to contribute funds, materials and volunteer resources to improve our aging
11 park system. The APF board seeks to generate support for parks and recreation, keeping
12 our parks *Clean & Green, Safe & Secure*.

13
14 Since our last report to the Assembly in May 2009, the APF now employs two staff
15 members directly and works hard in partnership with Municipal staff to raise funds, build
16 community support and administer park improvement projects and programs. The APF
17 board appreciates the continuing support of the Anchorage Assembly and the Municipality
18 of Anchorage staff as we seek supplemental resources for our parks, trails and recreation
19 programs.

20
21 APF work has resulted in private, federal, and state investments, and a tremendous amount
22 of volunteer support that has a cash value. Since its inception, the APF has raised more
23 than **\$14 million** for Anchorage parks. Specifically, the APF board has:

- 24 • Raised \$6,336,336 in private dollars or state/federal grant funding;
- 25 • Leveraged well over \$4,242,552 in volunteer time and materials;
- 26 • Spent \$5,428,285 in cash for park improvements;
- 27 • Secured an additional \$1,468,417 in Rasmuson Foundation challenge grants
28 (pledged funding if we meet their specified challenges);
- 29 • Secured an additional \$1,524,975 in State Legislative funding for reimbursement;
- 30 • And secured an additional \$540,065 in Federal funding for reimbursement.

31
32 Furthermore, the APF is the recipient of more than \$1.1 million in pending grants in the
33 2010-2011 state capital budget.

35 The Anchorage Park Foundation is bridging a gap in government capabilities by providing
36 a vehicle for private funding of the Anchorage park system, with particular focus on
37 enhancing and taking better care of our neighborhood parks. In the fall of 2008, 1000

1 volunteers completed the Anchorage Parks Report Card project, assessing the condition of
2 53 neighborhood parks throughout Anchorage. The APF and the Parks & Recreation
3 Department are working together to implement the fix-it lists in neighborhood parks
4 throughout Anchorage, beginning in 2009 with 14 neighborhood park fix-its. The APF
5 and Parks & Recreation Department will work together to accomplish the fix-its in 8 more
6 parks this summer. The Assembly is warmly invited to join the APF, the Parks &
7 Recreation Department and your constituents to complete the renovations of parks near
8 you:

9 Al Miller Park: Saturday, May 22, 9 am – 2 pm

10 Woodland Park: Saturday, June 12, 9 am – 2 pm

11 Ira Walker Park: Saturday, June 19, 9 am – 2 pm

12 Minnesota Park: Saturday, June 26, 9 am – 2 pm

14 Cheney Lake Park: Saturday, July 17, 9 am – 2 pm

18 Furthermore, the APF is currently accepting applications for 2010 Challenge Grants. With
19 generous support from the Rasmuson Foundation, the APF is proud to invite community
20 groups, park neighbors, recreation organization and parks volunteers to apply for up to
21 \$40,000 in cash to complete volunteer projects focused on improving city parks and trails.
22 To access an APF challenge grant, each grantee must match APF cash contributions with
23 labor, materials, or funds raised for the projects. The 2010 Challenge Grant Campaign
24 marks the APF's third cycle of working with the Anchorage community through funding
25 challenges to revitalize parks.

26 The Anchorage Park Foundation is also working with the Parks & Recreation Department
27 and hundreds of community partners to operate the summer 2010 Youth Employment in
28 Parks program. This year YEP will employ 30 teens and 7 adults to complete park
29 improvement projects (detailed below) and offer free recreation programs in Mountain
30 View. The APF appreciates the Municipality and Assembly's commitment to this
31 program.

32 In addition to Neighborhood Park Fix-It projects, the APF is working on the following
33 park improvements and YEP projects this summer:

- 34 • Anchorage Senior Center Trail: Creating trail connection to Chester Creek
35 Greenbelt (State Grant)
- 36 • Westchester Lagoon Raingarden Construction (Fish & Wildlife Service funding)
- 37 • University Lake Streambank Restoration & Trail Improvements (Fish & Wildlife
38 Service funding)
- 39 • Far North Bicentennial Park Forestry Work (Forest Service funding)
- 40 • Balto Seppala Park: Completing boardwalk connection (State Grant)
- 41 • Fish Creek Trail: Adding interpretive signage (2006 State Grant)
- 42 • Ship Creek Streambank Restoration & Fencing (Alaska Railroad and Fish &
43 Wildlife Service funding)
- 44 • Tanglewood Park: Completing boardwalk (2008 Challenge Grant)
- 45 • Spenard Recreation Center Improvements (2008 State Grant)

47 To highlight the added value the municipality receives from this nonprofit venture, the
48 board hereby submits this bi-annual report on the cumulative financial investments in
49 Anchorage Parks and Recreation Programs. The board believes strongly that these
50 investments are significant in monetary and social value, and improve municipal assets.

1 The board acknowledges the Anchorage Assembly as the elected body charged with
2 maintaining these beloved public lands, and looks forward to using this bi-annual report as
3 a means to communicate its contributions to the Municipality of Anchorage.
