This week, YEP crews planted trees on park land along Campbell Creek Trail near Taku Elementary School. We split up into groups, planting trees along both sides of the trail. As they grow over the next several years, these white spruce trees will help the trail look and feel better for trail users and park visitors. Planting lots of trees also helps support the area's wildlife. Spruce trees were removed from the area after being killed by spruce beetles, and we are working hard to replace those trees with young saplings. In addition, we located and removed invasive Bird Cherry plants from along Campbell Creek Trail.
